

The Marengo estate, based in the commune of La Morra, was established in 1899 by Giacomo Marengo, the great-uncle of the present custodian, Marco Marengo. Marco's father, Mario, took the helm after World War II in 1947 but unfortunately passed away in 2001. Marco, who had been helping his father for the better part of a decade, took over and transformed the business into a full-scale winemaking operation.

Mario Marengo's vineyard selection consists of just 6 hectares: 3.6ha planted with Nebbiolo to produce Barolo, 1.03ha planted with Nebbiolo to produce Nebbiolo d'Alba, 0.6ha planted with Dolcetto and 0.77ha planted with Barbera. The vineyards are worked by hand except for a few practices that are carried out mechanically (toppings, sprayings and mowing of grass). Spontaneous cover crops are left on the aisles and from 2016 onwards these are now sown on every second aisle and worked into the soil. Sustainable practices are followed in the vineyard and are certified through Valoritalia (Integrated production – SQNPI).

Barolo winemaking is consistent: Maceration with the skins for approx. 10 days depending on the vintage. Alcoholic and malolactic fermentations are natural with no yeast or bacteria added. After fermentation, the wine matures for 24 months in French oak barriques (15% new) and bottled during the following summer.

### Reviews from Antonio Galloni

#### **Mario Marengo Barolo 2015**

Four vineyards in the commune of La Morra (in the zones of Boilo, Serradenari, Roncaglie and Fossati) for a total extension of 1.8 hectares, go into the blend of the Barolo “base”. The grapes of each vineyard were vinified separately as the ripening period is different.

*“Marco Marengo's 2015 Barolo is lovely. Medium in body, gracious and lifted, the straight Barolo is a terrific wine in its peer group. Sweet red fruit and floral notes are front and centre in a mid-weight, nuanced Barolo that speaks with a sense of energy. It is a terrific entry-level offering from Marengo. Drink it over the next decade.” 91 points, Antonio Galloni, Vinous*

#### **Mario Marengo Barolo Bricco delle Violle 2015**

First produced in 1997, the Bricco delle Violle cru lies in the commune of Barolo and gets its name from the many violets that grow in the area during spring. Planted on calcareous soil at the beginning of the 1950s, the vineyard exposure is a full south at an altitude of 450 meters above sea level.

*“The 2015 Barolo Bricco delle Violle shows all the energy and linear drive that is typical of this site, even if the wine remains a bit compact today, with less of the generosity that it can show in some vintages. Dark red cherry, chalk, mint and floral notes are woven throughout this expressive, nervy Barolo. The purity of the flavours is striking. Time in the glass brings out a bit of the mid-palate sweetness that is missing at the outset. There is so much to like in this pretty, expressive Barolo from Marengo.” 93 points, Antonio Galloni, Vinous*

#### **Mario Marengo Barolo Brunate 2015**

The Brunate cru lies predominantly in the commune of La Morra, while a small part of the vineyard lies in the commune of Barolo. The Marengo family owns 1.2 hectares out of a total 25, and first produced this wine in 1974. The exposure is a wonderful south/south-east and the altitude is 350 meters above sea level. The soil is calcareous on the surface and the deeper strata are made up of rock. The vines are 60-70 years old and the vineyard density is 3500 vines per hectare.

*“The 2015 Barolo Brunate is another enticing wine in this range. Black cherry, spice, leather and liquorice all flesh out in the glass. The breadth and textural resonance that are such signatures of Brunate emerge effortlessly. I would give the 2015 a few years in bottle to come together. Even in the early going, the 2015 exudes class. The Brunate is the darkest and most powerful wine in this range.” 93 points, Antonio Galloni, Vinous*
